WHAT... is Oregon Promise?

Oregon Promise is a state grant that covers some or all tuition at any Oregon community college for recent high school graduates and GED® recipients.

WHO... can apply?



Be a recent Oregon high school graduate or GED® recipient



Enroll in an Oregon community college within 6 months of graduation



Have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or higher



Be an Oregon resident at least 12 months prior to enrollment

WHEN... do I apply for Oregon Promise?

HOW... do I apply for Oregon Promise?

- 1 Go to OregonStudentAid.gov.
- 2 Create an account within the OSAC Student Portal.
- 3 Complete the Oregon Promise Application.
- 4 Verify your GPA or GED® scores in the OSAC Student Portal.
- 5 File your FAFSA or ORSAA and list at least one Oregon community college.



HOW... will I be notified if I'm awarded?

OSAC will notify you by email once you have been awarded. Make sure to check your award status frequently in the OSAC Student Portal.

eMentoring and Student Support Program *For Current Recipients*



The Oregon Promise eMentoring and Student Support Program is intended to help Oregon Promise recipients stay on track and be successful throughout their community college journey. Oregon Promise students will receive emails and texts during the school year with friendly reminders, tips, and college-specific articles that will aid in their success.

Oregon Promise students also have the opportunity to receive eMentoring via an Oregon Promise eMentor, who will communicate with the student through monitored email or text. Students receive one-on-one support from an Oregon Promise eMentor on college-related questions or problems that may arise throughout the year. Topics can include financial aid, scholarships, academic interests, graduation requirements, navigating campus, and more.
