<b>November 1, 2016</b>	Scholarship application available in the OSAC Student Portal
<b>February 15, 2017</b>	<b>Early Bird Scholarship Application Deadline at 5pm (PST)</b> Applications will be reviewed and applicants can make corrections. Error-free applications are entered into a drawing for a \$1,000 scholarship
<b>March 1, 2017</b>	<b>Scholarship Application Deadline at 5pm (PST)</b> Final deadline to submit a Scholarship Application and all required materials
<b>May 31, 2017</b>	<b>Oregon Student Child Care Grant Application Deadline</b> Apply in the OSAC Student Portal
<b>Chafee Deadlines</b>	Chafee Education and Training Grant Application available in the OSAC Student Portal <b>August 1, 2016:</b> Fall term deadline <b>November 1, 2016:</b> Winter term deadline <b>February 1, 2017:</b> Spring term deadline <b>May 1, 2017:</b> Summer term deadline

### OSAC Scholarships

OSAC brings together donors to provide more than 500 scholarships for students

**How to Apply:** Complete the Scholarship Application and a FAFSA or ORSAA

**Award Amount:** Varies, depending on the scholarship program

### Oregon Opportunity Grant

Oregon's largest state-funded, need-based grant program for students planning to go to an Oregon college

**How to Apply:** Complete the FAFSA or ORSAA

**Award Amount:** Up to \$2,250 (2016-2017), awards are made until funds are depleted

### Oregon Promise Grant

Oregon's grant that provides funding for high school seniors and GED recipients entering an Oregon community college within six months of graduation

**How to Apply:** Complete the Oregon Promise Grant Application and a FAFSA or ORSAA

**Award Amount:** Pays for some or all community college tuition; funding is contingent on legislative approval

### Other State Grants

Oregon has several other state grants, including Chafee Education and Training Grant and the Oregon Student Child Care Grant

**How to Apply:** Complete the Chafee or Childcare Application and a FAFSA or ORSAA

**Award Amount:** Varies, depending on grant program

# OREGON STUDENT AID APPLICATION (ORSAA)

ORSAA is the State of Oregon's alternative to the FAFSA for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) students and other undocumented students. These students are not eligible for federal aid. However, they may be eligible for the Oregon Opportunity Grant, Oregon Promise Grant, and certain OSAC scholarships. The Oregon Student Aid Application is an online application on [OregonStudentAid.Gov](http://OregonStudentAid.Gov). It is a separate login from the student portal.

#### FAFSA Plus+ and College Goal Oregon

FAFSA Plus+ provides access to student-level data, trainings, and resources to help support high school seniors. High schools, TRIO programs, Tribal Education Agencies, and community-based organizations are eligible to apply. Host a College Goal Oregon event to provide FAFSA support to students and families.
